Learning foundational truths about God's word.

Day 1

Read James 1:25

Have you used a sponge in the bathtub or kitchen? A sponge absorbs water in a matter of seconds. Our brains are like a sponge, but they don't absorb water. They absorb all types of information.

One awesome thing about the bible is that it is full of truth. When we read scripture, we can be sure that what we are reading is true and there is no need to verify what we have read.
